About the Role

This role is for a full-time nurse to support clinical services delivered at HQ.

Responsibilities

- Deliver clinical services to cis men, trans and non-binary individuals in an appropriate, culturally safe and judgement free environment.
- Work in collaboration with HQ team to develop, update, and deliver educational programs and materials related to sexual health.
- Provide clinical advice, information, education and counselling to clients for testing, diagnosing, and treatment of a sexually transmitted and blood borne infections (e.g. HIV, syphilis, gonorrhea, chlamydia) as per guidelines.
- Assist with contact tracing and partner notification as needed.
- Perform advanced health assessments as part of the screening such as, anoscopy, venipuncture, and physical exams.
- Develop excellent working relationships both internal and external staff and collaborate to facilitate seamless service for HQ clients.
- Assess clinical and social support service needs and identify appropriate, culturally sensitive referrals to support overall wellness and meet the needs of patients.
- Update and maintain comprehensive electronic medical records.

Required Knowledge & Experience

- Current registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario (CNO)

- Ability to contribute to the establishment of a clinic environment that promotes excellence including optimum client service
