As a Peer Navigator, you'll play a key role in creating a welcoming, accessible experience for those using HQ's sexual health testing services.

Shifts & Availability: Flexible volunteer shifts are available during office hours (Mon–Fri 10am– 8pm, Sat 10am-3pm). Choose from four 2-hour shifts per day, with a minimum commitment of one 2-hour shift per week (subject to availability).

Training & Support: HQ provides full training and ongoing support from the Operations Lead. You'll work as part of a team, assisting new service users at the front desk and collaborating closely with staff.

- Registration at the kiosk
- Finding an available self testing room
- identifying the correct sample kits
- Meeting with the phlebotomist for blood draws,
- Dropping off samples at the lab.
